

The coordinator of program was Ass. Prof. Dipak Khakal.





















The coordinator of program was Ass. Prof. Devdatta Rashinkar.












Internal Competitions 21st December 2019

The coordinator of program was Ass. Prof. Sarita Badge And Dr. Kishori Ubhe.











On 13th January 2020, our college celebrated Swami Vivekananda Jayanti, Rajmata Jijau Jayanti and also Geography Day.








Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj Jayanti 20 February 2020

The coordinator of program was Ass. Prof. Dipak Khakal.















In 1986, The National Council for Science and Technology Communication asked the Government of India to designate 28 February as National science Day, which the Government of India accepted and the first National science Day was celebrated on February 28, 1987. The Govt of India felicitates scientists every year on this day who contributed to the field of science.



Our college also celebrated National Science Day on 28th Feb 2020 by arranging a field visit to the Pimpri Chinchwad Vidnyan Kendra' under the lead of our professor Dr. Leena Patil madam, and our professors, Prof Swati Dharmadhikari, Prof. Chhaya Hinge maam, Prof. Sarita Badge.
